Changes In Attendance Policy

Due to recent changes in state law, we have made some major modifications to our attendance policy and procedures. Reading Wednesdays

As part of our efforts to ensure that Ross High School is producing literate, well-rounded students as well as those who aren't over-reliant on technology as their primary source of information, we are starting a new sustained silent reading initiative this school year. For the first 25 minutes of the school day every Wednesday, every student in the building will spend time reading printed material of their choosing. Students are free to read a book, magazine, newspaper, etc. on any school appropriate topic that they choose. This is not an optional program so students should come prepared with their reading material each and every Wednesday. Students that are unable to bring reading material from home are encouraged to visit our school library.

Parking Passes

Students driving to and from Ross High School must purchase a parking pass and display it in their car at all times. The cost for a pass is \$20 per year (or \$5 per quarter). Students will be assigned a numbered parking spot by the school and should park there each school day. Students that

do not park in their assigned spot may have their driving privileges suspended or revoked.

In an effort to ensure that Ross High School is being both fiscally and environmentally responsible, the RHS monthly newsletter will no longer be printed and mailed home. In the Event of an Emergency

While our hope would be that Ross High School is always a safe and secure place, we must be prepared in the event of an emergency. The district subscribes to a notification system called One Call Now that allows for hundreds of phone calls, emails, and text messages to be sent within just a few minutes. In the event of an emergency, this would be the system that would be used to notify and inform parents. Please be sure that your contact information is always updated with the school in the event of an emergency.

School Fees

School fees are expected to be paid at the beginning of each school year and will vary based on the course requests of each student. With the passage of House Bill 1 in July, 2009, the state has declared that school districts may not charge fees for students eligible for free lunches under the “National School Lunch Act” and the “Child Nutrition Act of 1966” for materials needed to allow a student to fully participate in a course of instruction. This applies to instructional fees only and does not include fees for participation in extracurricular/co-curricular activities or enrichment programs that are not a part of the course of study. The law does not apply to fees charged for loss, damage or destruction of school property, equipment or materials. The fee waiver does not apply to students on reduced lunch pricing and unpaid fees from prior to July, 2009 are still required to be paid. Students that owe fees may be denied participation in extracurricular/co-curricular activities or events such as

Homecoming, Prom, etc. Payment plans are available to assist families in meeting this obligation.

Schedule Change Policy

After students receive their schedules and start their classes, there is a natural tendency to want to make changes to their classes. Please remember that the RHS master schedule was created based upon students' requests last spring. This means that the choices that students' made last school year determined what classes we offered, how many sections of classes we offered, and what teachers we hired. It would not be fiscally responsible to make changes to individual schedules after the master schedule is set.

To be sure that our students were aware of how important their choices were, all students received the Ross High School Course Selection Guide from their RAMBell advisor last winter, and each student had a one-on-one conversation with their counselor about his/her future career plans and the class schedule that would best help reach his/her career goal. The Course Selection Guide clearly outlines our policy on schedule changes. For your convenience, this policy has also been listed below. Please be sure that you review this information with your child so that he/she understands that schedule changes will not be made outside of this policy. Your help in this matter will ensure a smooth and successful start to the school year.

Schedule Changes

Changes in student course selections will be made only according to the following guidelines:

1. Approval for a schedule change will be authorized only for these reasons:
 - a. Errors made by school personnel.
 - b. A teacher recommended level or course change that is in the best interest of the student.
 - c. Consideration of schedule changes may be made for seniors who have been accepted into a Post Secondary Program.
2. Requests for schedule changes must be initiated by a written request from the student's parent or guardian to the appropriate counselor.

3. Requests for a schedule change based on the above three reasons must be made within the first five days of the start of the course.
4. Students are not permitted to drop courses outside of extreme extenuating circumstances. Courses dropped outside of these conditions will result in the grade of W/F on a student's transcript.
5. The final decision concerning any and all schedule changes rests with the high school principal.

Senior Pictures

Ritchie Photography is the official photographer for the Ross High School yearbook. To be included on the composite picture (the large one that hangs in the hall), you must have a sitting with Ritchie Photography. The deadline for completion is January 7, 2019. Ritchie will be offering low cost options to families who are interested and will be offering sittings at RHS throughout the fall. Code of Conduct & Dress Code Reminders

Staff will review the RHS Code of Conduct during the opening days of school during RAMBell. Please remember, the high school dress code is different than the middle school. The list below is not all-inclusive but there are a few key items that we ask that you review with your student prior to the first day of school.

- All shorts and skirts must extend at least past the end of the fingertips when arms are extended straight down at the sides.
- Clothing with holes, rips, frays, or tears that expose the skin above the ends of the fingertips when hands are placed at sides are not permitted.
- With the exception of school-issued chromebook cases, wristlets, and pencil pouches, backpacks, purses, drawstring bags, etc. are no longer permitted to be carried in the building during the school day. Additional information regarding this safety measure can be found on the enclosed document.
- No gauge piercings are permitted.
- Tank tops are not permitted unless covered by another garment.
- Patches, insignias, buttons, jewelry, clothing, or other items that include obscene, sexual, violent, gang, tobacco, drug or alcohol related writing or images are not acceptable. Items of clothing that

belittle others may not be worn (i.e. items that contain messages that are vulgar, offensive, obscene, or libelous; promote intolerance or confrontation, i.e. confederate flag, swastika; that denigrate others on the basis of race, color, religion, creed, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, or disability; that promote alcohol or drug use or violence).

Simply put, anything considered a distraction to the educational process is not permitted. Students are expected to be in proper attire on the first day of school. Students who are not dressed appropriately will be asked to change, and, if unable to do so, will be assigned an in-school suspension until appropriate clothing can be secured.

Vaccination Requirement for Seniors

As required by Ohio law, all incoming seniors are now required by law to show proof of a meningitis vaccine given after the age of 16. Seniors attending Ross High School or Butler Tech must provide a record from a physician, with the date the shot was given, to Ross High School. Records must be provided prior to the first day of the 2017-2018 school year. It is important that you obtain these vaccines and the record as quickly as possible. Students without proof of a meningitis vaccine will face exclusion from school as required by law in the state of Ohio. High School Busing & After School Supervision

As you are aware, in an effort to reduce expenditures, Ross Local School District's high school busing is a shuttle stop system. Information regarding transportation can be obtained by contacting the Ross Local School District's Transportation Office at 513.738.2900 or by visiting <http://www.rossrams.com/administration/8>.

In an effort to assist parents who cannot pick students up from shuttle stop locations, RHS will be offering a supervised after school service. Students can stay after school until 5:30 PM in a supervised environment within the building. During this time, students will be able to get extra help with homework, utilize computers, and complete activities of

interest. If you would like your child to participate in this after school program, please call 513.863.1252 and ask for Lynn Korb.

Drop Off Procedures and Pick Up Procedures

In an effort to ensure the safety of our students, please be sure to adhere to the drop off and pick up procedures outlined below. The map below helps to illustrate our procedures. Students who are unable to comply with driving and parking procedures will have their school driving privileges revoked.

Student Drivers

Students who drive to school should park in the event entrance parking lot and enter the building through the Event Entrance.

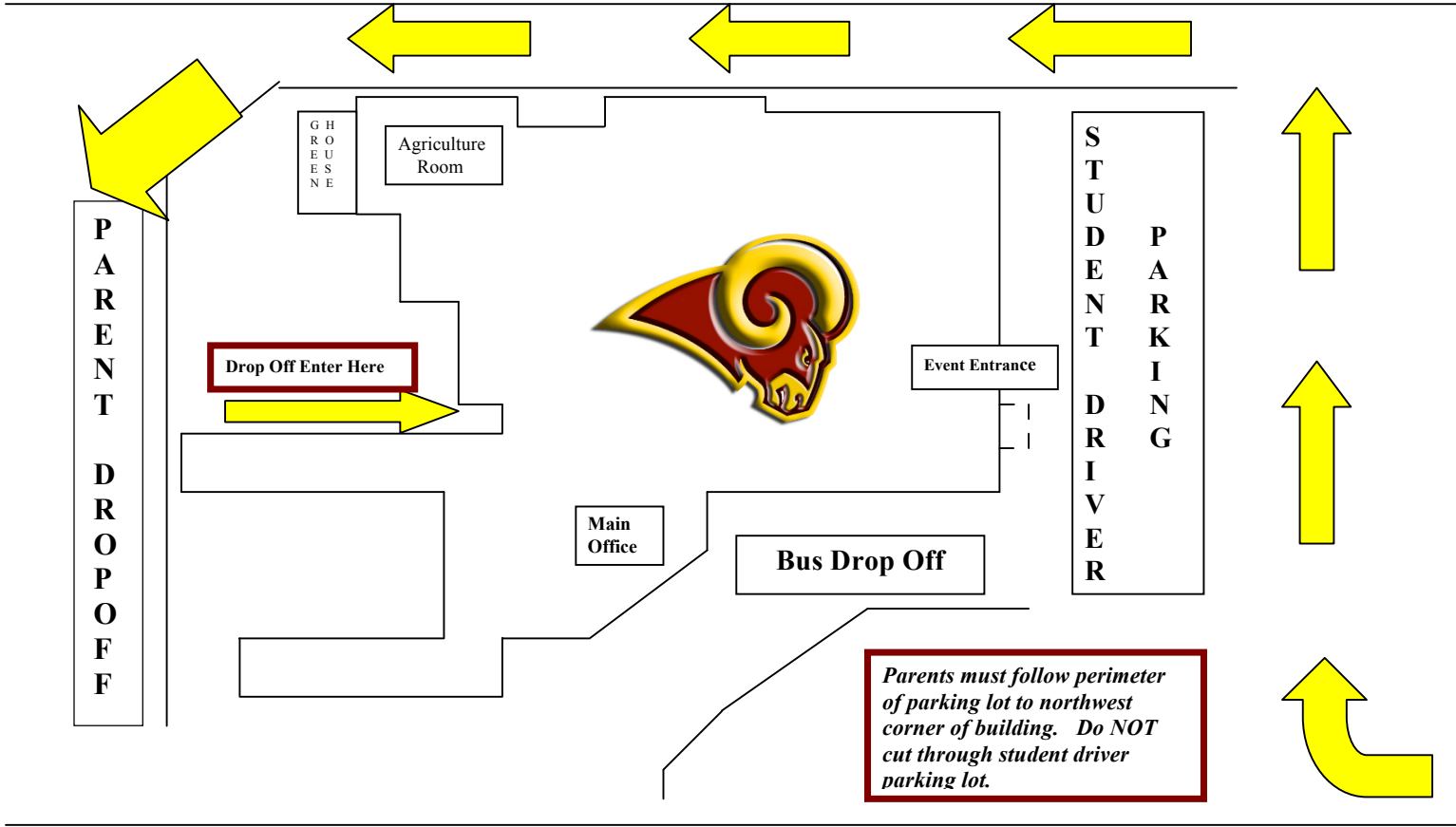
Bus Riders

Parents need to drop off and pick up students on the northwest side of the building. There will be traffic cones in place to help guide parents into one line for dropping off and picking up students.

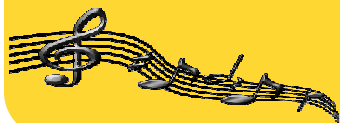

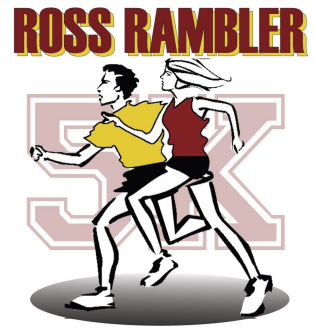
